

FIS Update December 22nd, 2023

Hello FIS Team,

Another series in the books! We had our final race of 2023 and it was a good one! We saw some great skiing today and earned some valuable FIS Points. Hannah Jensen finished 8th overall, Thea Torn 15th overall both making the front page or top 15! Both Thea Torn and Matteo Emanual Letter earned attack from the back which gave them each a large Toblerone bar! Again, this is a great award showcasing strong athletic skiing being able to battle from the back of the race and move the furthest up the finish sheet from the start order! We saw some great runs from most the other athletes as well and some good skiing from athletes who did not finish. All in all, we consider this series a success and are looking to continue to build our momentum from here!

Looking Forward

I have been playing with transportation to make our next project work as we will have 2 options. For the Kimberly speed project and Panorama Tech series we are offering an all-inclusive option for those that want to do the speed and the tech races. There is also the option to do just the tech races in Panorama for those that don't want to do the speed project. I am a big advocate for speed exposure at this age. Kimberly offers a great entry into the world of DH and SG skiing and with the added 3-day speed camp at the beginning this is a great opportunity to try out some long skis, get comfortable at speed and take what the athletes are working on in GS and stretch it out (or slow it down) with some longer turns. The speed camp is not just about training SG and DH it's also about refining some of the smaller movements of GS by lengthening the turns into some SG turns. The added speed helps the athletes to get more comfortable at speed making GS feel slow when they return to GS skis. This is a great project in a very controlled environment that we only get access to once a year and the only one of this caliber in the country.

How This Will All Come Together

With the high cost of renting vehicles, it is more feasible to fly the athletes rather than rent vans and drive everyone out. Two coaches will drive the gear out in a truck and trailer while one coach will fly with the athletes to Cranbrook. Everyone will fly to Cranbrook and take a shuttle service we have booked to their respective venues. The group that does both events will get shuttled up to Kimberly and latter shuttled up to Panorama. The second group that is just doing the tech races will also fly into Cranbrook on Jan 31st and shuttle up to Panorama. For the group that is doing just the tech races you will send your skis with the U16 truck and trailer which leaves WMSC on Jan 30th headed for Kimberly. Everyone will rendezvous in Panorama for the tech races. On the evening of the final SL race the athletes and 1 coach will shuttle back to Cranbrook to spend the night in a hotel before flying back home on Feb 5th.
